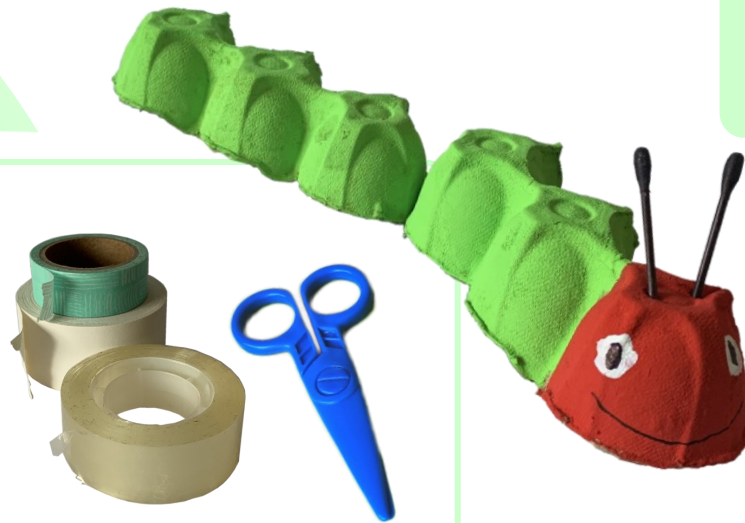
Why junk modelling?

What can my child use?

- Plastic bottles

- Cardboard tubes (wrapping paper, kitchen roll)
- Old CD's
